WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THIS PROGRAM?

Active duty service members and their eligible family members who are expecting a child, or have children under the age of six can utilize all of the services offered free of charge.

Let us meet your family in your home, in a safe and familiar environment.




Parents have the opportunity to discuss parenting topics such as:
